Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Required: **Appropriate** Protective Hearing Gloves Face Masks **Eye Protection** Welding Mask Footwear Protection Clothing **Breathing High Visibility** Harness Respirator Hard hat Overalls Hair Net **Apparatus** Use caution during the Halloween season, and take the steps in this Safe Work Procedure to prevent hand injuries when carving. Suggest any improvements or report any difficulties to your supervisor. **DO NOT** let children carve without supervision. REMEMBER **ENSURE** someone near by is trained in first aid, if someone gets cut while carving a pumpkin, apply direct pressure to the injury using a clean, dry cloth. If bleeding doesn't stop in 15 minutes, get to an emergency room or urgent-care clinic.

Use the Appropriate Tools: Pick the appropriate knife, cutting board and area for the activity.	 Instead of the knives in your kitchen, use the specialty tools in a pumpkin-carving kit—readily found online and in convenience stores and designed for pumpkin carving safety. These tools can saw through rinds, poke holes, and scoop out innards without being razor-sharp. The instruments are also generally small, which makes them easier to control than most knives and easier to use when making intricate cuts. For pumpkin carving safety, work in a clean, dry, and well-lit area, keep your hands and tools clean and dry, and take your time. 	 Carve pumpkin in a clean, dry and well-lit area. Select the appropriate tools for the activity. Don't leave children unsupervised. Keep a first aid kit close by. 	
Clean Area and Tools: Wash your hands prior to activity.	 Wash and thoroughly dry all of the tools that you will use, including carving tools, knife, cutting surface, and your hands. Any moisture on your tools, hands, or table can cause slipping that can lead to injuries. 	 Carve pumpkin in a clean, dry and well-lit area. Select the appropriate tools for the activity. Don't leave children unsupervised. Keep a first aid kit close by.

Carving the Pumpkin: Draw the pattern on the pumpkin with a marker. Carve your pumpkin with its top on. Once carving is finished, scoop the pulp out with a spoon and clean.	 With the top on you won't be tempted to put your hand inside and cut toward your hand. It is recommended to hold the top of the pumpkin to stabilize it and cutting with your carving instrument's blade pointing down. Instead of removing the top of the pumpkin to scoop out the insides, cut a hole in the bottom. If you're using a candle inside your pumpkin, you can then place the carved pumpkin on top of the lit candle—rather than awkwardly reaching inside the pumpkin to light the candle. 	 Carve pumpkin in a clean, dry and well-lit area. Select the appropriate tools for the activity. Don't leave children unsupervised. Keep a first aid kit close by. 	
Clean up area and enjoy! Ensure once all carving is finished the area is cleaned to reduce risk of slips and falls. Be carful when lighting the candle inside not to burn yourself. Most importantly ENJOY!	•	 Utilise an extended BBQ lighter with a long arm to minimise the risk of burns. Ensure the pumpkin and candle are not stored near any flammable material.
